Teachers' Federation Stop Work Meeting - Thursday 5 Dec

The NSW Teachers Federation has called a Stop Work Meeting for teachers to discuss the latest round of wage negotiations for teachers in NSW. The site for teachers in the Marrickville area has yet to be determined. The disruption to schools and families is acknowledged and the union has said the meeting will be as quick as possible. It is scheduled to begin at 8:30 and conclude around 9:45 when staff will make their way back to school.

At Marrickville Public School we will be able to provide only limited supervision this Thursday Dec 5 from 8:40 until 10.30am. Where possible, can we ask you to please keep your children home until that time? Regular classes will commence as soon as all staff attending return.

P&C AGM

This Wednesday evening, the P&C will hold their AGM and all positions will be declared vacant. Marrickville Public School staff would like to take this opportunity to thank all members of the P&C executive for stepping into these roles of responsibility. We would especially like to thank Sebastian Welsh and Kate Berry, and wish them well in their new school adventures.

Air quality at MPS

Sydney's air quality problems are continuing due to severe bushfire activity.

The school has been managing this situation through modified play times for all students K-6. This includes closing some playground spaces during lunch and recess, opening the school hall as a quiet play area, and restricting students to non-running games and activities. We also provide daily reminders to students about managing their health, with a focus on reporting to teachers immediately if they or any other student feel unwell. We remind any students with asthma to carry their puffer at all times and to make sure they access the hall during play times when available.

We will continue to monitor the situation in the coming weeks, taking advice from the Department of Education. We advise families to contact the school if you have concerns.

REPEAT: Secured Internet Edge, MPS Internet and Phones - Thursday 5 Dec

On Thursday 5 December MPS is scheduled for the installation of Secured Internet Edge. This service aims to deliver faster and more secure internet to the school. It will also have greater scalability to support evolving IT-enabled learning initiatives, along with increased network capacity for accessing DoE applications and services.

It will require a server outage of up to 3 hours. During this time our school internet access will be down and there may be intermittent disruptions to the phones. School staff will check emails via alternate devices and will have their mobile phones on hand in case of emergency. Please be assured that many schools have already undergone this process and school staff will be following up on any messages left during interrupted service.

REPEAT: Changes to MPS Sentral and SchoolEnews in 2020

In 2020 Marrickville Public School is moving to Sentral 'Cloud'.

This will enable us to maintain current systems such as Reports and attendance, but will give us greater flexibility in parent communication options. This may include: changes to how we deliver the newsletter; the possibility to send sms messages regarding daily attendance, sick bay alerts etc; digital forms for excursions approval; smartphone parent app for the parent portal with handy access to the school calendar, and more.

This is an additional cost to the school, but we understand our communities call for a more streamlined approach to our communication. We will begin to phase out our use of SchoolEnews for Newsletter and note delivery in Term 1 2020.

How you can help

As Sentral is a third party app, we need to load your contact details from the DoE systems into Sentral. Late 2019 or early 2020 you will be asked to confirm your contact details such as preferred email, preferred mobile phone, emergency numbers etc. Your prompt return of this information will be appreciated.

What won't change

To make an appointment with MPS staff, you will still be asked to contact the school via the office, phone or email.

President

The president is responsible for the overseeing of the P&C and the associated committees, presiding and running the P&C meetings and liaises with the NSW P&C Association and the Principal over any P&C and school matters. The president is responsible for:

- The successful functioning of the P&C.
- Fostering participation of all members.
- Welcoming new members & supporting volunteers.
- Chairing Meetings.
- Signatory on bank accounts.
- Acting as the P&C spokesperson.
- The President is automatically a member on sub-committees.

Vice President (2 x positions)

The vice president presides over the meeting. The Vice President supports the role of the President and may be required to:

- Chair meetings or parts of meetings under the direction of the President.
- Chair meetings in the absence of the President Signatory on bank accounts.
- Take on the responsibility of supporting / leading sub-committees.
- Represent the President if the President is not available.

Secretary

The Secretary shall attend meetings and keep a record of all business conducted, collect and receipt any mail received, and then hand the mail onto the appropriate sub-committees. The Secretary is responsible for: Taking minutes at meetings.

- Writing outgoing correspondence.
- Maintaining records.
- Signatory on bank accounts.
- Receive and table incoming correspondence.
- Give notice of meetings.
- Maintain official records.

Treasurer

The Treasurer receives and deposits all monies, maintains records, draws cheques and presents accounts to each meeting, and presents all records for auditing each year. The Treasurer is responsible for:

- Receives and deposits money.
- Maintains records.
- Draws cheques and presents accounts.
- Signatory on bank accounts.
- Must ensure books are kept up to date.
- Audit organising and coordinating audit of books.
- Reporting of all transaction and a bank reconciliation at P&C meeting, an annual report to be presented at P&C AGM.
