#### From the Principal ....

#### Remembrance Day

This year 11 November marked the 100th Anniversary of the Armistice, which ended the First World War (1914–18). Originally called Armistice Day, this day commemorated the end of the hostilities for the Great War (World War I), the signing of the armistice, which occurred on 11 November 1918—the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. The Allies observed Armistice Day as a way of remembering those who died, especially soldiers with 'no known grave'.

Last Sunday Australians observe one minute's silence at 11 am, in memory of those who died or suffered in all wars and armed conflicts The Flanders poppy became accepted

throughout the allied nations as the flower of remembrance. The red poppies were among the first plants that sprouted from the devastation of the battlefields of northern France and Belgium. 'Soldiers' folklore had it that the poppies were vivid red from having been nurtured in ground drenched with the blood of their comrades'.


#### **Selective High School Applications**

#### **Band Week**

Next week is Band Week and several fun activities have been organised throughout the week to assist in promoting our Junior and Senior Bands to the rest of the students in our school. A lolly guessing competition will be held all week and the winner will be announced on Friday, 23rd November at recess lines. On Tuesday, 20th November, Year 2 students will watch a demonstration concert by the senior band to enthuse them to play a musical instrument. This will be followed on Thursday, 22nd November with Year 2 students being given the opportunity to try out musical instruments with the intention of encouraging them to join the band in 2019. The senior band will perform at the 3-6 Assembly on Wednesday, 21st November, led by our very highly respected conductor, Dr Clark. Thank you to Dr Clark and to Mrs Brice, our band organiser and junior band conductor for supporting the band activities at our school, along with many parents who are part of the organising committee.





#### Don't Stop The Music

Last Sunday evening at 7.30pm I watched the first of a 3 part series of 'Don't Stop the Music' which aired on the ABC. It is a wonderful production highlighting the transformative effects of teaching music in primary schools. Guy Sebastian and Dr Anita Collins are musical mentors on this program which follows one Western Australian underprivileged school's journey using musical instruments to benefit their students. As Guy explains, 'the importance of music in the school curriculum cannot be underestimated.' He went on to say that he was a singing teacher in numerous schools in Adelaide and he 'saw first hand how music would light up a child's face and lift them above all the things that weigh them down.'

It has long been known through research that music assists with the study of mathematics, however, Dr Collins stated that 'Music and language are an overlapping network in the brain, so we actually use music, our music processing network to learn how to speak language. Music develops the auditory system, which in turn helps children understand nuances like rhythm or tone, common to both sound and language and how they carry the meaning in subtle ways. Assal Habibi of the University of Southern California said that 'music training during childhood, even for a period as brief as two years, can accelerate brain development and sound processing.' Another benefit is improved executive function such as understanding emotions, making plans and paying attention. Learning an instrument also leads to the development of teamwork. I would really recommend this series.

In 2018, the Kellyville PS SRC are collecting toys for the Children's Hospital at Westmead. This christmas, there will be over 300 sick children and babies staying in hospital. All donations can be added to the large box in the school office, or handed to classroom teachers.

#### Donated toys must meet the following guidelines:

- For health and safety reasons, toys must be brand new, unopened and still in manufacturers' packaging or with the tags attached
- There's no need to wrap the toy as we need to see it to make sure it's appropriate for each child
- We don't accept toy guns, swords or war games
- All toys must meet Australian Safety Standards
- Toys can't have small or easily detachable parts that can be swallowed
- Toys can't have moving parts that can pinch fingers or hair
- Toys can't have dangers such as breakable glass, protrusions, or sharp edges
- We don't accept electrical, spark-producing toys because of fire regulations
- Glue or paint in craft kits must be non-toxic and non-flammable
- All DVDs need to be G or PG Rated
- But don't despair—while that might seem like a lot of exclusions, here's a shopping list of toy types that are warmly welcomed because they suit a broad range of children.
- For general hospital use and all age children
- Personal DVD players, iPads, iPods, Sony Playstation 4 console and G/PG rated games (these are used by our Child Life Therapists) DVDs (G/PG rated only) Nintendo games
- Movie vouchers, iTunes cards, EFTPOS gift cards.
- General art and craft supplies for Child Life Therapy such as small and medium blank canvases, glitter glue sticks, batteries.
- Stickers eg Disney Princess, Frozen, Minions, My Little Pony, Peppa Pig, PawPatrol, Trolls,
- Moana, Superheroes, pirates, unicorns, fairies, Barbie, Dinosaurs, Octonauts, mermaids, butterflies, flowers, cars etc.


