Learning & Support Teacher (LaST)

Appointed by the Department of Education.

Works with students and all teachers to meet learning needs.

School Learning Support Officers (SLSO)

School learning support officers (teacher's aides), under the supervision and direction a teacher, assist in classroom activities, school routines, and the care and management of students with special needs.

School Counsellor supports students, staff & parents with:

- · assessments: behavioural, emotional, academic
- providing strategies to staff and parents
- providing counselling and support for students as required
- small and large groups / involvement in whole school programs
- referrals to external practitioners when required and liaison between private practitioners and the school
- Speech Therapists in our school (All Communication Matters)



Preparing your child for school

Literacy - How can you help at home?

- Read picture books to your child every night
- Make reading an enjoyable family activity
- Children point to words as you read them out
- Read words in the environment (street signs)
- Read anywhere at any time books, magazines, cereal boxes, shop signs
- Make up stories begin with simple ones and let your child finish it



Preparing your child for school

Literacy - How can you help at home?

- Encourage any type of writing letters, shopping lists, birthday cards
- Coloring in and drawing pictures
- Write their name
- Hold a pencil correctly
- Play with play dough to enhance fine motor skills
- Use glue and scissors as much as possible
- Encourage, encourage, encourage!



Preparing your child for school

Mathematics - How can you help at home?

- Playing board games
- Rolling dice and seeing what number comes up
- Counting forwards and backwards
- Reading numbers in the environment (letter boxes)
- Finding patterns in the environment together
- Take them shopping and use coins
- Simple dot to dot or colour by number activities

Best Start Kindergarten Assessment is a state-wide assessment that helps teachers identify the literacy and numeracy skills of each student at the beginning of Kindergarten.

- Carefully read the Parent Information Pack

- Return your Permission to Publish/ICT Agreement Form with both sides ticked and signed. We can then add you to the Kindy 2021 Seesaw Group and begin interacting with the students. Forms can be dropped back to the box in the office.

- Ensure all enrollment documents are completed and update the office with any changes
