Dear Parents and Carers,

We are excited to launch Sound Waves our new spelling program for all students K-6. Sound Waves uses synthetic phonics to explicitly and systematically teach students how sounds (phonemes) are represented by letter/s (graphemes) to form written words. Sound Waves encourages students to learn to spell using the four areas of spelling knowledge:

- Phonological using sound-letter relationships
- Visual using memory of the visual features of a word
- Morphological using parts of words to build word families
- Etymological using word origins and derivations.

Each week students will be introduced to a new phoneme and will explore the range of graphemes that can be used to represent that sound. They will have access to a set of list or extension words that align with the sound they are studying and they will engage in a variety of word play activities using these words. The list or extension words and associated activities will vary depending on their year level.

Successful spelling relies on an understanding that words can be constructed from meaningful parts. Sound Waves will focus on developing students' ability to hear the sounds in unfamiliar words and apply their understanding of the phoneme / grapheme relationship to spell them correctly.





We would recommend that your child engage in these activities for at least 10 minutes a night. It is important to emphasise that by engaging in these spelling activities that goal is not to learn to spell words from memory but rather to draw students' attention to the letter sound relationships.
